Please consider this as proof of your reception of KJLT on January 18th 1959. I want to thank you very much for your fine report.

About your visit to Nebraska--you saw the FCC monitoring station at Grand Island, Nebraska which is about 150 miles, or a little less east of North Platte.

When you were in North Platte, our call letters were KNEB, 1 KW on 970 KC with directional antenna. The government had made an error in the soil map and when the new soil map showed 5 kilowatts possible, with only one antenna tower we changed to the maximum power for this frequency and took down the second tower.

The station is non-commercial and noticing our letter-head you see the type of station that we are.
