Dear Dave:

This is to confirm or QSL your reception and logging of WERA on Jan 4, 1963 from 12:10 to 12:41 EST.

In reply to your questions, these tests are for the purpose of frequency checks and adjustments to our directional array, etc, and we are not trying to see how far we can get out on skip. Actually, our pattern is nulled out toward you because of WAKR.

WERA is a 500 watt directional antennae station, with studio's located in Plainfield, and transmitter in South Plainfield, N.J.

We are a daytime-only station, broadcasting from 6:30 am until local sundown seven days a week. We transmit a figure eight pattern in a north-south direction using three towers. Our transmitter is an RCA type BTA-1R, 1000 watt unit operated at half power.

We thank you for your interest and comments. Similar tests are scheduled for the third friday of March, June, September, And December, between 12 and 1 am est.

If you should ever happen to be in our vicinity and would like to see our installation, you may drop in at the transmitter anytime during normal programming hours. We would enjoy talking with you.
