Dear Sir:

It was with much pleasure that we read your report on our frequency test program broadcast Feb. 7.

We use Gates equipment nearly altogether. Your antenna system puts ours to shame. We use a grounded vertical shunt fed antenna. Fed through a coaxial cable $\frac{3}{4}$ ". Our studio is in town in the business district and we at the transmitter are located near the edge. Two of us run the transmitter end and the announcers run the studio end. However the program you heard originated at the transmitter.

Hollywood, California, the object of our test program received us very poorly. I can almost say "as usual". Our signal just doesn't seem to want to go west.
