Dear Mr. Thomas:

Yes, you were there!

Thanks for the report on KRAC the night of November 15th. Your report tallies out with our log perfectly.

Sorry about the boy with the ragged tone. Our chief Engineer picked him up here too, on his way home from the test. Waited about 15 minutes for an identification, but it never came. He remarked to me about it the next morning.

We thought you might be interested in our equipment here at KRAC. We're using a 1,000 Gates BC-IJ Xmitter. we series feed to a tuning box, and then shunt feed into a 192' tower. Ground radials are 240 in number. 120 are 150' long...the rest 50' feet. Each radial is tipped with a 5' copper clad steel rod and there are 22 more rods in the ground system. We are located in an adobe field which is not noted for it's conductivity, but we manage to get out wonderfully. Constantly serve an area of from 60 to 80 miles, which is fine considering we are directly between two mountain ranges.

When you come down this way again, drive over to KRAC. You'll find the latch-string always hanging out. And if you can locate me around town, I usually have a spare dime for a cup of coffee. Drop in.

Again, many thanks for your report, and look forward to hearing you again. We're on the third Saturday of every month.
