Dear Mr. Thomas:

Thank you for your signal report of the WKYC Standby transmitter. Sunday nights [Monday mornings] is the only time we sign off the air so that time is utilized for testing purposes. The standby transmitter is a 5KW Westinghouse 5V-1. Our main transmitter is a Westinghouse 50-HG 50 kilowatt which feeds a Franklyn Antenna 905' tall. The AM Antenna is the tower which also holds our television and FM Antennas.

To answer your question about the ownership of the radio station; the radio and FM stations have been purchased by Nick Mileti who also owns our Hockey, and basketball teams and he also has just become owner of the Cleveland Indians Baseball team. His application is presently on file with the commission so the station remains the property of NBC until such time that the commission rules.

This station was originally WTAM with the television station being added in 1948 with the call letters of WNBK. In 1956 NBC sold the stations to the Westinghouse Broadcasting Co who changed the call letter to Kyw - AM, FM, and TV. The stations were then traded back in 1965 and the Cleveland stations became WKYC-AM, FM, & TV with Westinghouse taking the call of KYW to Philadelphia, Pa.

If FCC approves this latest sale, it is not known at this time what the call letters will be.

I hope this has answered you questions.
