
### Now for your letter.

- a) Here at CFCL, we are using Directional Pattern, day and night.
- b) Our Antenna System is as follows: "3 towers, 300 feet high, spaced 707 feet apart". They are on a line bearing 0-13 degrees through North. Location North Latitude, 48d.26'50", West Longitude, 81d.23'08".
- c) Mode of operation: Directional, three elements, series fed, guyed, uniform cross section, base insulated.
- d) As for our coverage in Hearst, we do not consider it in our primary coverage.

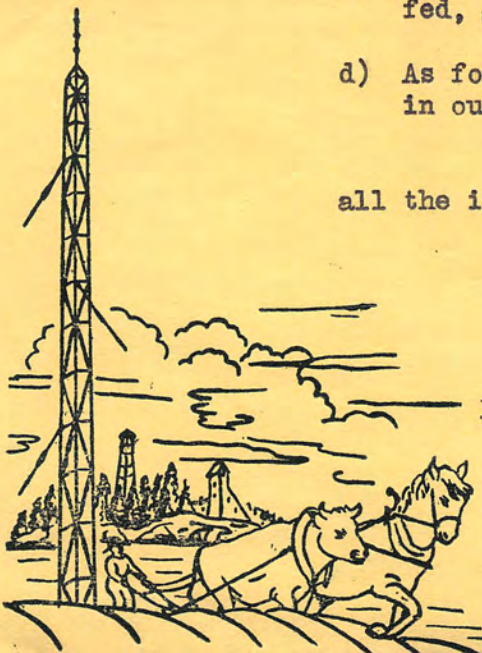
