
Thanks, Dave,

for your report on this station. You make it rather difficult to verify the report accurately from this end because of the long delay from the time you read the signal until now. You are accurate when you say we had a newscast at 5:00 P.M. giving temperature so there is little doubt in my mind that you were able to follow the station for the 2-1/2 hours indicated in your log.

I was rather surprised to get the attending data on the eclipse and the amount of detail that was contained in it. The North Country to which you refer has always been like that for radio--nothing on the dial during the daytime to speak of and three thousand stations jamming the frequencies at night. FM has never gone well in Canada and never will in my opinion now that television is here.

This letter, however, will serve as verification for your records as having received CFJB on 1090 kilocycles, June 27th, 1954 between 3:30 and 6:00 P.M. E.D.T. You did not hear us in your normal home QTH because of the two stations you referred to. Baltimore has 50 kw to our quarter gallon and thus can make a little more noise. Our coverage in this country with the 250 watts is nothing short of fantastic and I know from my own experience that the station can be heard and heard reasonably well at distances beyond a hundred miles from our tower. Thanks again for your report. The station opened December 24th, 1953.
