First I wish to thank you for the very interesting report re reception at the time of the eclipse and to apologize for being so tardy answering your letter.

I found the report all the more interesting in that we have always considered that particular area as a complete dead spot as far as this station is concerned, we have never received a report of any sort from that district or in that general direction, And we do a good deal of testing after our regular broadcast hours and have run several DX broadcasts for various radio clubs, receiving reports from several areas in the states. So it appears that the eclipse was responsible for fine reception at that time. Am enclosing a couple of clippings from our local paper which will give you times eclipse visible here.

Would be interested in any further reports you might have, or subscription service. Also if I can assist with any observations in this area, I have a Ham licence (VE3AXH) and several receivers and antennae available, hoping to hear from you at your convenience
