

We are very pleased to know that you have logged our station, and trust that this verification will assist you in your DX reports.

We have a General Electric Studio Console, and the transmitter is located a quarter mile away. It consists of a 250 BTA R.C.A. Transmitter which feeds an Ajax omni-directional tower, which is 130 feet high.
