Dear Mr. Thomas:-

We are happy to acknowledge receipt of your letter in which you identify programs broadcast by this station on Saturday, September 16, 5.00-5.45 A.M.

This letter will confirm your outline of programs carried to identify the station.

In reply to your question about our directive array, it is directed east and west. We are on Eastern Wartime.

CJFX, Antigonish, is on Atlantic Wartime.

Details of our transmitters, that you ask for, consist of a Marconi 33B driving transmitter, also Marconi 37B driver either of which are used to drive the final 1 K.W. 49-C Marconi, which in turn feeds the directive equipment.

We are on the air twenty-four hours a day with the exception of Monday morning from 1.00-5.00 A.M.

We will be on five kilowatts, sunrise to sunset, shortly and would appreciate hearing from you any time you hear the station and your comments.
