
Dear Mr. Thomas:

Awfully pleased to receive your report of reception of KTIL on the morning of October 17th, 1947. We have had several reports from the East -- Belleville, New Jersey, two from Ohio, a large number from California, Iowa, Washington and Oregon. We've even had four reports from New Zealand, a most remarkable and unusual report because of our low power. We do have one of the finest transmitting sites in the country -- low, pasture land, and with a salt water bay just 500 yards distant.

Until our frequency monitor is delivered, we will be making daily frequency checks with Point Reyes, California, from 1 to 1:30 A.M., PST. Maybe you can tune us in again soon during this period. Our regular broadcast hours are from 6 A.M. to 10 PM weekdays, and from 8:30 A.M. to 9:30 P.M. on Sundays.
