Many thanks ~~for~~ that fine report you sent us. The program appears to have been a decided success and we are all looking forward to staging another soon. Am enclosing our QSL card. Hope you like it.

With regard to your interference there, I have a report from Member Jack Quintrell ,Camp Lee Virginia ,who claims that WTOP on next channel and WSAP, Portsmouth, Va. threw their carriers on around 620 AM. Whether or not either of these stations were on at the time you mentioned, I have no idea. As you suggest, I would say it was due to cancellation of WJBK by a station probably located south of you. The two carriers oppositely poled and of equal magnitude , canceled- and our signal at right angles/ unaffected, and appeared stronger. It is a rather unusual occurrence, I will agree. Our furthest report to date NW was fm George Hotton, Milwaukee, Wis . who reported us QSA5 R7-9 and received practically the whole program including announcements. Eldon Addy, Marcus, Iowa got us QSA 3 R 5-6 (WJBK-?-2-3), ~~he~~ received most and stated interference fm WJBK not as bad as he had expected.
