Dear Mr. Thomas:

It has been quite a long time since we got your report on our check on December 1st., 1952, but today I happened to go over some old papers in my desk and found that we had not answered same and hereby doing so and at the same time presenting our humblest excuses.

Your notations are correct and we are very pleased to know that our small 1000 watts station is capable of reaching so far away even thou it is due to the mysteries of radio wave propagation.

We conduct our regular frequency checks on the third Friday of every month from 2:15 to 2:30 A.M. EST. but our regular operation starts at 6:00 A. M. Monday thru Friday up to 11:00 P. M. EST and at 7:00 A. M. on Sundays up to 11:00 P. M.

There are 23 stations in Puerto Rico, and Mayaguez which is the 3rd. city of the Island has five of them; imagine so many stations on an Island only 3,500 miles square, and there is the daddy of them all, WKVM operating on 810 kc. with 25,000 watts power. Try and log that one.

Well, hope I have not been too profuse, but you well deserved a good answer if you consider that it took us more than a year to answer your letter.
