Dear Sir:

We thank you for reporting on the DX programme we broadcast Monday morning December 7th. from 4:30 to 5:00 a.m.

The details concerning your reception are correct. We regret that you didn't understand every thing; so, to complete the CHRC's story, let us tell you that our station went on the air for the first time in 1926. It is a 5000 Watts station operating at 800 Kc. We broadcast in French only. Our studios are located at 39 St. John Street in Quebec city and our transmitter is at Charny, a suburb of Quebec.

During the first year, the station was operated from a private house but in 1928, a permanent location was obtained for the station including its transmitter at the Victoria Hotel, in the heart of the city. A disastrous fire in 1942, completely destroyed our station and a large part of the hotel. Shortly afterward we bought the large four story building in which we occupy the top three floors. Beside commodious business offices on the second floor we have a complete broadcasting plant on the third which includes two large studios with their control rooms, a modernly equipped announcing booth, a record library which contains approximately 75,000 pieces.


Fourth floor includes an attached recording studio, a news room with B.U.P. and Canadian Press Teletypes; and janitor's quarters.
