Dear Mr. Thomas,


This will verify your reception of WSSC on January 25, 1971, at 1:15 a.m. EST on 1340 kHz.

I am pleased that you were able to receive us as well as you did. I received three other reports, one from Philadelphia, one from New York, and one from New Jersey. However, none of the other DXers were able to hold us as long as you did. Although we received no reports from Florida on this program, we have received a few reports from there on various frequency tests that we conduct monthly.

In answer to your question regarding the existence of WSSC-FM, we do not have an FM station. The station that you heard was WWDM here in Sumter, which operates on class-C channel 267 (101.3 MHz) with an ERP of 2.9 kw and an antenna height of 245 feet. Address your request to Chief Engineer Ernest Jenkinson. He will be glad to verify.

Thanks ever so much for your interest in our station and its first DX program. I am sorry it has taken so long to verify your report. About a week after the program had been done we lost two employees to other stations in the area. Because of this, I had a lot of extra duties and responsibilities to take care of. As a result of this, I am now Program Director of WSSC. Please understand that it has taken these past months to get myself and the station back on an even keel.
