It was unfortunate that you could not log us, but sun-spots and Q.R.M. from other sources are the constant bane of D.X.'ers and those who try to provide D.X. programs.

C.J.N.B. is a 250-watter on 1240 kcs., using predominantly Northern (that's Western) Electric equipment. Our transmitter is the 451-A, loaded into a 'T-type' (steel strikes left us minus a tower!) Our studios are small, but mighty;- a main control, auxiliary control room (for recordings), Studio "A" & a smaller Studio "B" and the various offices. Our control room has three turntables, a 23C console, all interwired for Talk-Back and Cueing, and remote cueing from the console.

North Battleford has a pop. of approx. 7,000, and is a typical bustling Northern Canadian city.


