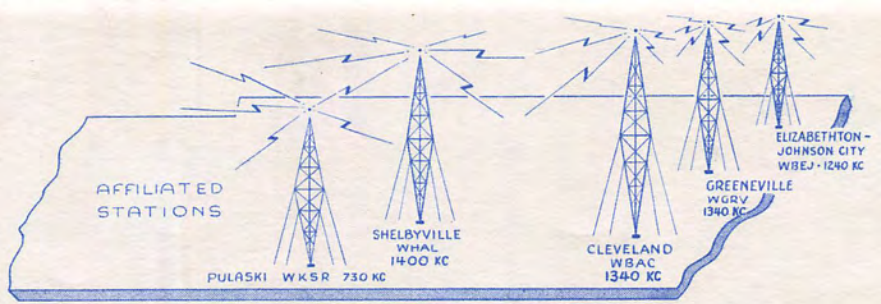

In regards to your reception report of our station on Nov. 10, 1948; We would like to take this time to thank you very much for your time and trouble for this report.

In regards to the set up we employ here, we use Raytheon Equipment throughout. Employing a RA 250 transmitter using 810 in push pull as the power amplifier being driven by a single 813. On this we add the modulator section using 46B4 in parallel push pull driving a pair of 810. The transmitter site is located 1/2 miles NW. of downtown Pulaski.

After checking our studio log against your reception report, we are very happy to report that we are practically sure it was WKSR that you were receiving.

Hoping that this verification will be of good use for any radio club work, or of any use to which it may be put.
