Your report of KCFH during our DX-Test on 14 November 1955 has been received, and this letter is to verify your reception between 3:26 and 4:15 AM, Eastern Standard Time. Data logged by you check 100% with our log of the program.


This is a daytime station -- serving Cuero, Yorktown and Yoakum... three cities in DeWitt County, Texas... and we program music and news exclusively. The equipment is all Gates, except for Presto turntables... And, we use a 187' foot guyed antenna. Power is 500 watts, and frequency is 1600 keys. We have no regular scheduled test period, as we're monitored by Kingsville or Austin during our regular broadcast day...

Reports from around the country for this particular test show one thing: there was a lot of weather activity! Everyone reported high static level... the south reported heavy fading... and just about everyone reported rain. Our best signal seemed to get into Iowa, Colorado, Oklahoma and out to California. The boys in the northeast must have really had a tussle to get us through! We are tickled pink with the results, so far -- with 35 reports in, and all correct.

Dave, I'll be moving to a better position at KIOX in Bay City on 3 December -- and will look forward to hearing from you at that QRA... especially if you should pick us up. We'll be testing a new 1 kw Gates xmtr over at Bay City in the very near future -- and perhaps will dedicate one of the tests to the NRC -- if it is possible.
