Thanks a lot for your reception report of KLIF dated February 19, 1950. Since your report agrees with our official program log, we are happy to send you this letter of affirmation.

KLIF commenced broadcasting as a daytime only station on November 9, 1947. Operation around the clock was begun February 11, 1950. KLIF is the key station for the Liberty Broadcasting System.

KLIF operates on 1190 kilocycles with a full time power of 1000 watts. The station is Raytheon equipped throughout. The transmitter is a Raytheon model RA-1000. During the period from local sunrise to sunset KLIF operates non-directional using a Wincharger Wincharger type 300 radiator 225 feet high. KLIF operates directional at night using the above tower and four Wincharger type 150 towers 225 feet high. The five towers are on a line bearing 112° true and spaced 378 feet from the adjacent tower(s).
