This letter will confirm your card of the 10th and the complete report of the reception of our station. Station W S L S has a power of 250 watts, operates on a frequency of 1500 Kc. with unlimited time.

I was much interested in the antenna system you use and the make of receiver as well as other details you mention in the card. I was sorry to hear that our reception was crowded out by QRM from other stations but glad to have the report on our reception even if you only had our station for one half minute.

We are on the air from 6:00 A.M. till midnight throughout the week and from 9:00 A.M. till midnight on Sundays. Occasionally we send test programs in the small hours but these have no definite schedule so we suggest you listen in the small hours some morning and if you pick us up then the interference problem will not be as serious.
