Dear Mr. Thomas;

I am in receipt of your letter of February 9, 1970 as regards WCVR Randolph's test program. Thank you very much.

Your letter is very interesting as you mention that WVOJ is 'the big messer-upper'. They put a good signal in up here in Vermont after we go off the air. Many evenings on the way home from the station I listen to WVOJ on the car radio. As to WCVR's test on the morning of February 9th, I picked out of my own library a group of spanish type records because they were loud and noisy with the idea that they might possibly cut through the QRM. Then along with this I prepared a tape with a tone broken up with the station call letters in morse code. This latter idea was not mine but had been suggested by Mr. Ernest Cooper, Editor of your clubs monthly publication. It proved to be a good idea and as a result I already have received a report and tape with the call letters in code standing out very clear from a listener in Denver, Colorado. So, if you are around on the morning of February 23 I shall run the tape again and might possibly cut through WVOJ 'junk'.

I am sorry not to be able to confirm your reception as I can not definately conclude that it was WCVR which you heard through WVOJ.
