The antenna is 201 feet from the ground but it happens to be on the roof of the building in which we are located and that makes it about 150 ft. high. Our location is not so good but in time we are moving out on the hill and we should be able to put out a nice signal with our 250 watts. I think the elevation is about 1200 ft. above sea level. I am the K-1 of the Chief Engineer here and also the other operator. He and I have been the only two operators for over a year now but we are hoping to get our other operator back before long.
