We are always glad to hear from our friends of the air. Would be glad to have you advise us how we come through on our new wave length and whether there is less interference on your radio from other stations on our new wave. Do we have fair volume there?

We note you ask in regard to Station WBAZ. This has been out since about 1923 or 1924 and failed. WOBU is the only station in the city. We have been on the air somewhat over a year now. You will find our schedule at the top of this letterhead. With the exception however, that we are now on from ~~12 to~~ 11 to 12 mornings and 1:30 to 3 in the afternoon. The evening schedule is shown above.
