Thank you for your DX Report, received here in late November.

Your listing of program details is more than sufficient to demonstrate that you received this broadcast. Therefore, I am pleased to submit this letter of confirmation to you in hopes that it satisfies your request and wishes.

WDEV(AM) is a full-time directional station operating 1kW into 3 towers Nighttime, and 5 kW into 2 of those same towers Daytime, with both of their major lobes at 129 and 309 degrees (weighted toward 129).

Our programming covers almost the entire music spectrum, with unusual features. But our main thrust is news, information, and sports. I believe you were listening to a tape delay of a regional auto race, after a full day with a local half-marathon in the morning, and a Red Sox game followed by a tape delay of a Giants game on our AM while running a tape delay of a Patriots game on our FM, in the afternoon. In all fairness, this much sports in one day is unusual.

Many years ago, before the AM band became as congested as it is today, we used to receive lots of DX reports from everywhere. In the early sixties, for example, we received one from England and another (our record-holder) from South Africa. But those days are gone, and we are fortunate enough to be receiving any DX reports at all. So thanks again for your interest and for taking the time and effort to listen for our signal and responding as you have. We wish you continued good fortune with your hobby and your life.
