As my hobby is D-Xing and I understand that you are to leave the air shortly, I would greatly appreciate if you would give this letter your attention and possibly verify my reception.

Date: March 12, 1951.

Time: 5:00 to 5:30 a.m. EST. on 1490 Kcs, 250 watts.

Reception: Fair to good with slight fading and some static. No station interference on you as all eastern stations are off on Monday AM. (This was my 2nd Monday to hear you.) Readable about 70%.

Receiver was a 5 tube Satchell-Carlson, portable.

Program: 5:01, Music, Your Just in Love.
Your announcers were a man and a woman.
5:05, Station Identification, "Your in tune with KWIK, Burbank."
5:06, & 5:10, Jimmy Durante Vocal selections.
5:13, Music, by Johnnie Desmond.
(A cycle modulation tester came on at 5:15 forcing KWIK into the background,).
5:16 to 5:25, Announcing and talking by the "disc jockeys"
5:26 Musical Recording.
5:29, Was announcing when Eastern stations came on the air, thus preventing any further reception of KWIK.

I hope this report will be of some interest to you, and if it is correct I would greatly appreciate if you would confirm my report and VERIFY my reception of your station.
