Our transmitter is a Collins 21A and is located about 8 miles west of downtown Jacksonville. The towers (3) are Blaw-Knox self supported each 1/4 wave and standing 170 feet above ground.

At the time you heard us we were operating on directional. Ordinarily we go off the air at midnight but due to the threatening hurricane we remained on all night relaying weather reports.

Thanks very much for the card and may I express my wishes in hoping that you may again hear WMBR from Jacksonville, Florida.
