I had the pleasure of hearing your station on its special March of Dimes program, this morning, January 27th, from 4:25 to 4:42 a.m. EST. As my hobby is DXing I took note of your reception here in the Tri-State area of West Virginia, Kentucky, and Ohio. My receiver is an RCA Victor table model.

Reception of WGST was Fine here as you were readable 100%. There was no station interference on you as you were "blasting out" over the 920 spot here. Weather conditions were also favorable here. Your program was as follows:-

- 4:29, Musical selection, "Down Yonder."
- 4:30, Gave boost for March of Dimes. Also gave phone number as Alpine 7411.
- 4:31, Selection, "Cry." by Johnnie Ray.
- 4:35, Announced that WGST had been on the March of Dimes program since 8:00. Also gave thanks to staff members and telephone operators for their time and assistance in this program. Gave approximate amount of collection.
- 4:38, Music, "Dixie" by Red Foldsy.
- 4:41, Gave regular uniform sign-off and that you would return to the air at 7:30. Gave total contributions as \$1681.00
- 4:42, Left the air.

Although this report covers only a small portion of your program, I hope it will be of some interest to you, and if it is correct, I would greatly appreciate if you would confirm my letter and VERIFY my reception of your station, WGST.
