It was an extreme pleasure to receive your letter of November 1. We are very happy to learn that our signal is reaching out far beyond our expectations and that we are being heard in Ohio. It is also interesting to note that our signal overrode WADC .

We have had letters from all over the South and Southeast, and even one from Walnutport, Pennsylvania, and believe me, we really appreciate each one.

We are using Collins equipment, throughout, with a stainless 200 foot guyed tower with a ground system of 120 hard drawn copper wire radials 200 feet long, located 2.4 miles outside the City Limits of Warner Robins.

Once again, Mr. Thomas, may I say that we were very happy to hear from you and receive your detailed log of our broadcast of October 31, from 1:50 to 2:50 A.M. EST. Your log chart checks with our log sheet of the October 31 broadcast exactly.

Thank you for so kindly enclosing a postage stamp for our convenience in answering your letter. Sincere warm wishes from the "Sunny South".
