Dear Sir:-

I had the pleasure of hearing your station on its test program, this morning from 3:58, to 4:40 a.m. EST. (2:58 to 3:40 a.m. CST). As my hobby is D-Xing I took note on the reception of your station here in the southern tip of Ohio. Reception of your station was Fine here as you were readable 100%. There was no interference on you except from 4 to 4:15 when a Puerto Rica station was testing, but this interference was very little. Your program was as follows:

- 3:50 Cycle Modulation.
- 3:58, Announced, "This is Radio Station WNGO, Mayfield, Kentucky. This is Radio Station WNGO Mayfield, Kentucky, owned by the West Kentucky Broadcasting Company Inc., operating on an assigned frequency of 1320 kilocycles, with 1000 watts." Tone Modulation followed.
- 4:30, Announced, "This is Radio Station WNGO Mayfield, Kentucky, operating on an assigned 1320 kilocycles."
- 4:31, Tone modulation continued till next announcement.
- 4:40, Announced, "This is Radio Station WNGO Mayfield, Ky., operating on an assigned frequency of 1320 kilocycles. WNGO is owned and operated by West Kentucky Broadcasting Company Incorporated."
(Believe you left the air following this announcement.)

I hope this report will be of some interest to you, and if it is correct, I would greatly appreciate if you would confirm this letter and VERIFY my reception of your station, WNGO.
