
This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 19th of November, in which you give details of your logging of our frequency check transmission of that morning, during the period of 0500 - 0515 AM.

The details given therein indicate without any doubt that you copied WFAU, and it is a pleasure to verify your reception of our signals at that time.

WFAU uses a Raytheon 250 watt transmitter, feeding a quarter wave vertical radiator through 420' of 7/8" co-ax line. The ground system consists of 120 radials approximately one quarter wave long. Our offices, studios, control room and transmitter are all located under one roof, making a very compact plant, situated about one mile from the business center of town, and located on a main highway, US #201.

Of course WFAU, like most any local operation, would rather have all the listeners in our own territory tuned to us, than to cover the more distant spots, we do appreciate the reports that come to us from the folks doing DX hunting, - and I might say that we receive quite a few, particularly in the middle west and south.

Thanks again for the nice report and I would like to wish you the best of success in your quest for DX.
