Dear DX listener:

Since our station first went on the air in December of 1949, we have received reports from all over this nation of ours. We are very glad to know that under certain circumstances and at certain times we are able to put an intelligent signal anywhere in these United States.

Your report of August 14, 1950 was found to be correct. Our regular frequency check night is on the second Monday of every month at 1:15 am CST.

Our transmitter is an old model RCA high level plate modulated job, so old that we believe it's the one Marconi used to experiment on. Our transmitting tower is 185 feet tall. We operate on the combination engineer-announcer principle of which we have three such men. Our transmitter and studios are both located in the same building. All of our equipment is RCA with the exception of our limiter which is Western Electric.

Thank you so much for your interest and we hope you can pull us in again sometime.
