Dear Mr. Thomas:

The staff and management of WSRS wish to thank you for your letter indicating reception of our station on the morning of October 22, 1951. The log you submitted was correct and this letter is a verification of your reception of WSRS on the above date. WSRS maintains a 24 hour per day schedule except Sunday morning of each week, when the station is off from 4:00 AM-7:30 AM, EST.

We are located in an eastern suburb eleven miles from the center of Cleveland. The studios and transmitter are located on the second floor of a two-story building. The tower is 200 feet high and is situated 35 feet above street level. The top 60 feet is a four-section RCA Pylon used for our FM operations. We use ungrounded counterpoise consisting of 120 wire radials emanating every three degrees from the tower base. The station is completely RCA equipped, including a BTA 250-L, 250W transmitter using two parallel 810 tubers in the final. Input power to these tubes is 360 watts.

Again I wish to thank you for the report and hope this letter is of value to your DX confirmations.
