Glad to note your previous reception of our station in 1951. We conducted our first equipment test on Nov. 30, 1948 and have received hundreds of DX reports since then. The DX record is held by Mr. Ken Mackey of Dunedin, New Zealand who sent us a tape recording following a test in 1952. Most reports come from members of the National Radio Club.
