Dear Mr. Thomas:

Thank you for your card of February 1st, describing reception of WIGM during our frequency check period on that date, 2:30 to 3:00 a.m. CST. Your log of my program matched closely, therefore this letter will serve as varification of your report.

Radio Station WIGM is on the air the first Wednesday morning of each month for its frequency check with the Phelps Laboratories of Minneapolis, and as you noted, most of the program is a repetition of the March "Stars and Stripes Forever", and to aid in our identification by our checking point. Our regular broadcast hours are 7.a.m. to 10:00 p.m. and we are affiliated with the Mutual Broadcasting system.

The equipment is of RCA make, excepting the limiting amp and a few miles which are WE. Our studios, transmitter and offices are housed in the same building and situated just outside the city limits of Medford, a town of about 2400 population, and located just about in the center of the state. Our antenna is a single radiator, 155 feet high, which is situated in a swamp.

On behalf of the entire staff of WIGM, I wash you much continued success in DXing.
